Consultation on a Scheme of Continuous Enforcement of Motor Insurance

I attach at Annex A the Department for Transport's consultation paper on the Regulations to introduce a Scheme of Continuous Insurance Enforcement (CIE).

What is the consultation about?

To use a vehicle on the road or public place, its use must be covered by a valid policy of third party motor insurance as set out Section 143 of the Road Traffic Act 1988. The consultation is about the regulations required for commencement and operation of the scheme of continuous enforcement of motor insurance authorised by Section 22 of, and Schedule 5 to the Road Safety Act 2006. Its provisions introduce a new offence of being a registered keeper of a vehicle which does not meet statutory insurance requirements.

Who is the consultation likely to be of interest to?

This consultation will be of interest to motorists and other road users, motor insurance companies, representative bodies, regulators and members of the general public with an interest in motor insurance matters.

The Impact Assessment

The Impact Assessment which analyses the costs and benefits for a Continuous Insurance Enforcement scheme can be found at Annex C. You are invited to comment on it, highlight any unintended consequences of the policy you foresee, or raise practical enforcement or implementation issues, giving evidence wherever possible.

Deadline for receipt of responses

In the consultation document we have set out the particular questions on which we are looking for your particular comments. The deadline for reply to this consultation is 17 April 2009.

How to respond

The consultation period begins on 20 January 2009 and will continue for 12 weeks until 16 April 2009. Please ensure your response reaches us by that date.
